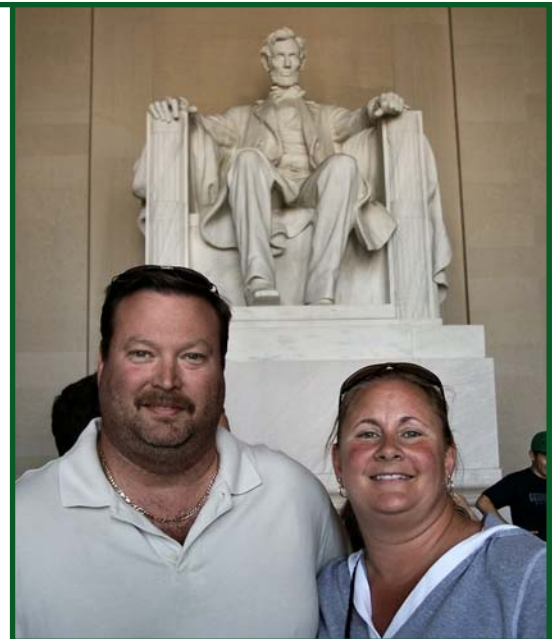
THE LATVAS IN HAWAII
