

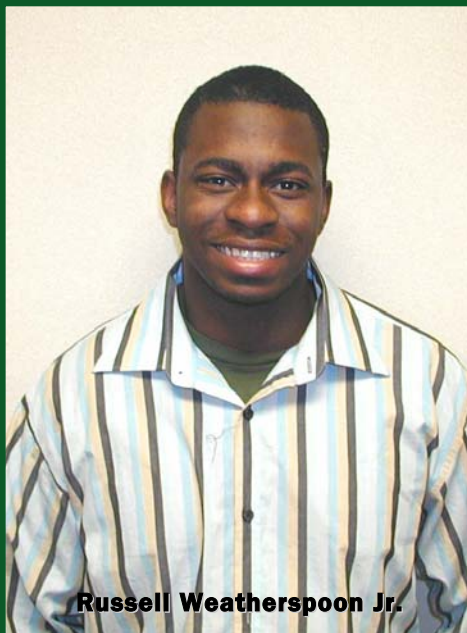

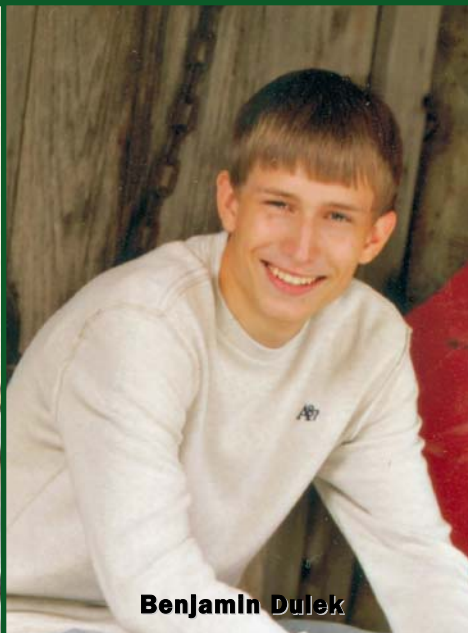

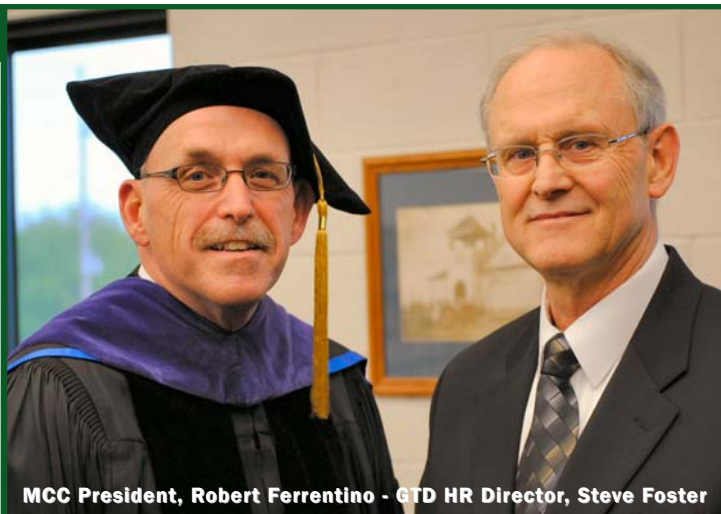
STEVE FOSTER HONORED BY MCC

GTD Human Resources Director, Steve Foster, was honored at Montcalm Community College's commencement exercises on May 7. It started several month's ago, as Steve accepted the invitation of the college's president, Mr. Robert Ferrentino, to be their commencement speaker. As a member of MCC's first graduating class of 24 in 1968, Steve received the first Associate's Degree in Arts and Sciences. His preparation at MCC enabled him to continue on to Michigan State University where he recieved his bachelor's degree in Business Administration in 1970. Through the years, MCC has had an exemplary record of preparing students for both the world of work and for more education. Consequently, the focus of Steve's commencement address to the graduates was, "feel confident that MCC has prepared you for your next step, whatever that may be. But, you must couple this with a commitment to life-long learning if you hope to be successful. And, being of service to others in your community will not only give you great personal satisfaction but help you on your journey to success."

At the conclusion of his address, the surprise of the evening for Steve was the announcement by MCC Board of Trustees president, Karen Carbonelli, that he had been selected as the 2010 recipient of the Stanley & Blanche Ash Distinguished Service Award, presented annually to individuals who or organizations that, through a sense of purpose, community concern and leadership, have helped Montcalm Community College serve the people of this area.
